PROJECT HOMEWORK

Choose **one** project to work on at home over the term.

Be as creative as you like – you can make, write, draw, build or present it in any way!
You will share your project with the class during the last week of term.

1 Crime Through Time

Choose a crime (e.g. theft, smuggling, witchcraft, poaching) and research how it was dealt with in different periods of history.

How and why did punishments change?



2 Famous Criminals

Research a real-life criminal (e.g. Dick Turpin, Mary Read, the Kray twins, or a more modern criminal).

Create a fact file, presentation, poster or even a short dramatic retelling of their story.



3 Punishment Around the World

Find out how different countries (past or present) have punished criminals. You could compare with today's UK system or explore unusual or surprising punishments!



4 Create a Courtroom

Design a model, poster or digital version of a courtroom. Label the key roles (judge, jury, solicitor, defendant, etc.) and explain what happens in a trial. You could even include a real or made-up case!



5 Crime in Our Local Area

Investigate a crime (or type of crime) that has happened in our local area, past or present. What happened? How was it solved? What punishment was given? Present your findings in a creative way.



6 Be Creative!

Have your own idea? That's fantastic! As long as it links to our Crime and Punishment topic, you can choose a different approach – maybe a piece of art, a song, a comic, a board game, a video or something completely different!
